

ESSENTIAL LEARNING FOR KINDERGARTEN

At the end of Kindergarten, students should be able to demonstrate mastery of the following material:

LANGUAGE ARTS

- Recite letter names and sounds
- Distinguish between consonants and vowels
- Recognize short and long vowel sounds
- Write first and last name, capitalizing only first letter
- Identify and produce rhyming words
- Identify beginning and ending letter sounds and middle vowels
- Recognize Kindergarten high frequency words
- Write 1-2 sentences independently
- Use proper capitalization and punctuation in a sentence
- Read simple sentences and short stories
- Demonstrate comprehension: Who? What? When? Where?
- Recall 3 sequential events
- Communicate ideas and information clearly in sentence form
- Form uppercase and lowercase letters correctly

BIBLE

- Acknowledge the Bible as the inspired Word of God
- Identify God as the Creator of all things
- Retell and respond to Bible stories
- Memorize and recite Bible verses
- Acknowledge that God keeps his promises and cares for us
- Understand that Jesus is the Son of God
- Explain Jesus' purpose for coming to earth
- Communicate God's love to others
- Participate in service projects

- Understand simple fractions
- Tell time on the hour

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

After completing PE in Grades K-2 students will understand the importance of the human body and how to use it as continuously growing beings. PE challenges encourage growth in a variety of ways through activities and games which promote problem solving, cooperative learning, and overall physical well being.

- Demonstrate competency in motor skills and movement patterns needed for physical activity
- Demonstrate understanding of movement concepts, strategies, and tactics as they relate to physical activity
- Achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical fitness
- Exhibit strong personal and social behavior such as respect toward others, self, and equipment
- Use individual gifts to honor and glorify God
- Enjoy physical education and use it as an outlet for social interaction and self-expression
